AMPEG'S ECHO TWIN for 1962 -- literally two complete amplifiers in one, each with its own power supply -- has been received most enthusiastically by prominent professionals and leading dealers everywhere.

This unique instrument, featuring both reverberation and tremolo, incorporates two matched 12-inch Jensen speakers driven by individual but identical 15-watt amps, all in a single cabinet.

It has three inputs and two independent channels, both with separate volume, tone, speed and intensity controls. Though designed especially for guitar and accordion it performs equally well for piano, voice, violin, etc.

Using one channel the performer has a commanding 30 watts of full, distortionless power. The flick of a handy panel switch brings into play the efficient 15-watt amp for the echo signal, either in combination with tremolo or independently. An auxiliary double foot-switch also activates the echo and/or tremolo for optional remote control.

The multiple uses and combinations of effects achieved by this twin system makes it one of the most versatile amplifiers on the market. For example, one of the more obvious advantages of the ECHO TWIN is its emergency or "spare tire" aspect. Should tube trouble develop in either circuit the "show can still go on."

When the speed control is tuned on full, an interesting repeating type of echo effect is obtained. Another unusual sound, compellingly weird to the listener, is produced when the twin tremolos are tuned in and out of unison.
